# Emily Goes Green

When recycling Post-It Notes, cut off the sticky part and throw away in your garbage – recycle the rest of the Post-It Note. The sticky part gums-up the recycling machinery and in some cases, large batches of paper are thrown out and not recycled because of this. However, you can now purchase Post-It Notes that have water-soluble sticky parts that do break down and don't cause problems.
